Simpson Housing – Zion Progress

- construction taking longer -
- working to be done by Jan 10
- open house date to be confirmed

- the operational aspects of the new center will be communicated at the open house
  - o open house will be noted within 2 weeks
- hoping to see a lot of NH volunteers take part in the shelter:
  - o Erin the meal group is someone who could help establish volunteer activities
  - Sarah will reach out to Steve to see if there are other volunteer activities

Regarding how to address the homeless person living in the Rain Garden at 31st and Blaisdell

- greet them -
- ask what their plans are, maybe noting that its hard to live where they do –
- Agate is St Stevens & House of Charity -
- We would want to hear that they have someone working for them on their behalf to find shelter. Some have housing/shelter and are choosing not to use it.
- Note that any eviction will be planned
- need to be straight with them

#### If we ask them to leave -

- can call the Henn Co team to do a check in with them
- maybe they can help move them along if they don't leave.
- County is the better option or call Agate for a referral

5th Precinct is coordinating homeless activities across the city:

- Police would hopefully be the last resort after the other opportunities are expired.
- have had some success with them, but it's hard to know 100% how things will go

They may not always be 'homeless' but just maybe they can't stay where they 'live'. Usually breaks down by thirds -1/3 truly not sheltered, 1/3 have shelter but are not able to stay there, 1/3 have shelter but are choosing to live outside.

## Neighborhood Properties:

- Group reviewed the 7 properties and associated costs and incomes on each site.
- The garden sites generate roughly just over \$1,000 from rents
  - For example, Pleasant generated \$1,150 in 2022, costs were \$1,475
- Group to see if the surveys sent out to the neighborhood in 2019 which were intended to gauge attitudes toward the future of the sites.
- Some of the sites have poor soils which resulted in the homes being demolished as they aged quickly
- It was agreed that the board needs to be involved somehow in managing the gardens
  - Maybe the gardens are self-managed with a report out to the board or subcommittee
- It was also agreed that the sites need to be sustainable, meaning costs are covered by the rents
- Its possible some of the gardens could become more program based
  - Maybe find a group to run the gardens for a funded purpose
    - Might be best for the Pillsbury & 3034 Pleasant gardens
- Subcommittee to reach out to developers who have worked in the neighborhood recently for ideas as to how to use
  - Michael Pink & Jim Kumon
- Agreed that the neighborhood needs to determine how to invest in the properties or not.
